**WALK AMONG THE STREETS AND MONUMENTS OF A NEIGHBOURHOOD THAT FOR CENTURIES HAS EMBODIED THE MOST TRADITIONAL SENSE OF ROME: TRASTEVERE.**



Our walk around Trastevere will allow you to discover an area of the city that has been developed since the Roman period – mainly with buildings for merchants and commerce – but which has evolved intensely from the Middle Ages until the late nineteenth century.

The overlaying and overlapping of architectural styles and urban solutions has created the area's characteristic streetscape, made up of lanes with picturesque views, imposing buildings, medieval towers, neoclassical pediments, and columns or architectural fragments of ancient temples built into the wall fabric of later buildings. All this laid out along the right bank of the Tiber near the bend in the river where the Tiber Island is found, a place that is crucial for understanding the birth and development of Rome.

Our walking tour is made up of some of the most important places in Trastevere: the Convent and Basilica of Santa Cecilia in Trastevere (where you can see the famous Saint Cecilia by Stefano Maderno; the ciborium, a masterpiece of gothic sculpture by Arnolfo di Cambio; the extraordinary

Last Judgment by Pietro Cavallini (1289-93), as well as the archaeological complex that was found under the church), the Church of San Francesco a Ripa where you can admire the Beata Ludovica Albertoni, one of Bernini’s masterpieces, and the Basilica of Santa Maria in Trastevere, the heart of the neighbourhood and perhaps the first church in Rome officially dedicated to the Virgin Mary.
